The All-Star game ended as a tie between both teams with a score of 12-12. The talents matched each other equally in both defense and offense.

The Matua All Star Game has been the perfect place to see who's got next, where they provide football fans glimpses of future high school talents. The current teams in 2019 are split with each of the seven teams of the GNYFF equally divided.

Each All-Star Game has gone down to the wire! The name of this year's game is defense dominated.
